## PROGRAM DIRECTOR'S UPDATE

**I**t's good to see Michigan slowly open back up. The Program Team is continuing to bring to you more of the programs you have been enjoying, with some new programs online and soon, in person!

Earlier in June, my mother drove 11 hours from New York to come and visit me for the week. We had a great week together; we drove out to South Haven to see the Jewish Resorts Historical Marker, visited some friends who live up in Zeeland and played tourist in Grand Haven. Hopefully this visit will tide me over until I travel to New York for Thanksgiving!

Michigan is slowly reopening and we are doing the same at CoM. Due to the demographics of our membership and out of an abundance of caution, we will continue to hold services online through the High Holidays; we will be live streaming High Holiday services and more information on that will follow. Shabbat morning services will continue to be held over Zoom each Saturday morning and you can sign up for them at [congregationofmoses.org/shabbat](https://congregationofmoses.org/shabbat).

We are planning on having a once-a-month outdoor Friday night Shabbat service beginning in July. During these outdoor Shabbats, we will maintain the social distancing rules and everyone will be required to wear a mask. More information on how the outdoor service will work will follow soon! Second Cup Study Group will also continue through the end of August meeting on Sundays at 4:30 pm and on Wednesdays at 7:00 pm.

The Program Team is beginning to look at ways to have some outdoor programming take place at CoM. On Sunday, July 19th, we are organizing a Garden Walk, including CoM members and master gardeners who invite you to visit their home gardens.

Participants will meet at CoM, where they'll receive a map of all the gardens they will be viewing that day. Similar to the outdoor Shabbat, we will maintain safe social distancing guidelines and all participants will be required to wear face masks.

We will also be continuing to hold Havdalah Happy Hour on Saturday nights over Zoom, which will now

# NEWS FROM HADASSAH

## Hadassah Researchers Identify Source of Blood Clots in COVID-19 Patients

*Blood samples from Covid-19 patients showed sicker patients had a high concentration of Alpha-defensin, a peptide involved in blood clot formation.*

Researchers around the world have been puzzled by a deadly COVID-19 complication that affects 30 percent of patients: the formation of large and small blood clots that create lethal blockages in the patient's lungs, kidneys, heart and brain. Prof. Abd Al-Roof Higazi, head of the Hadassah Medical Organization's Department of Clinical Biochemistry and Division of Laboratories, has identified the mechanism that causes these clots.

Prof. Higazi and international colleagues published a seminal paper in the leading medical journal *Blood* about their discovery that alpha-defensin, a peptide (an amino-acid chain) speeds up the creation of blood clots and prevents their disintegration. This finding is crucial in understanding what is happening to COVID-19 patients because existing anticoagulant drugs don't impact alpha-defensin.

"We took blood samples from patients in Hadassah's COVID-19 Outbreak department," relates Prof. Higazi, "and found a high concentration of alpha-defensin." The sicker the patient was, the researchers found, the higher the concentration of this peptide.

Prof. Higazi and lab manager Suhair Abdeen are working on a new way to dissolve the blood clots.

They are testing colchicine, an oral medication used for gout and Familial Mediterranean Fever. It has succeeded in reducing alpha-defensin levels and blood clots in mice, and they are awaiting approval to begin human trials.

Prof. Higazi believes if the drug reduces blood clots in COVID-19 patients, it will vastly reduce the numbers of patients needing respirators. "These patients have numerous blood clots in their lungs, preventing normative blood flow," he explains.

In addition, he says, "We can give the drug to those with mild symptoms to prevent the development of blood clots."
