Welcome Rich!

Our new Building Manager, Rich Wojtas (pronounced WOY-tas), brings a varied background to this new position. As a longtime friend of Rod Anderson, he is familiar with CoM's operations, having helped with rummage sales and the repair of the faucets at our cemetery. When he learned Rod was retiring, he expressed interest in the position because it combined his talents in mechanical operations and technical aptitude. He is becoming familiar with Jewish holidays and Yiddish expressions.

He was born in Deckerville, MI, on the Canadian border, on a small family farm which produced wheat, soybeans, corn, navy beans, cows and beef cattle. Actually, he was born in Sarnia, Ontario, because that town had better medical facilities than the hospital near the farm. Rich and his father were the sole farm workers, as his three sisters were exempted from those duties. As a teenager, the family transitioned from farm life and his father pursued a bachelor's in Agricultural Science that led to the family moving to Marshall after his father accepted a position with the Department of Agriculture.

Rich attended Ferris State and Western Michigan, studying printing technology. While at WMU, he

competed in windsurfing for ten years in B Fleet in Michigan and won first place in a state championship, joining a college friend in the sport. Maybe he'll help us develop a CoM windsurfing team if there is interest!

A part-time job in printing while in high school led to this career path, as he always had an affinity for electronics and, as printing became more digital and computerized, it was a natural fit. He worked for EPI Printers in Battle Creek for 36 years until Covid-19 layoffs last year ended his career there.

Rich has always had ties to the CoM community, traveling in the same circles as Gillian Thommes



ETHICAL LIFE CLASSES RESUME

From political and financial scandals to rapid progress in biomedical science and technology, the complex issues of modern society are, at their core, issues of ethical and moral concern.

Now more than ever, we require a solid understanding of how Jewish ethics can inform our discussions and decisions about the critical questions of the day. Judaism has a long history of wrestling with moral questions, responding to them in a way that considers all sides of an issue.

Rain Garden Events

Rain Gardens Protect Groundwater and Feed Pollinators

This spring, CoM will be planting the first of several rain gardens, designed to protect the local watershed and improve the environment for pollinators.

Rain gardens are a simple but effective means of absorbing and filtering the toxins from roofs, driveways and roads that pollute local bodies of water. Planting native Michigan shrubs and perennials in the garden will help feed birds, bees and butterflies yet require minimal care. The garden will also reduce the amount of lawn to be maintained, an important step in reducing our carbon footprint.

Come join a brief information session on **Wednesday, May 5 at 7:00 pm on Zoom** where you will learn about how rain gardens are protecting the environment in Kalamazoo and around the country. You'll get familiar with the native Michigan perennials to be planted in our rain garden and why using native Michigan plants is so important



in protecting the ecosystem. Cheryl Vosburg from the Kalamazoo River Watershed Council will join us.

Then on **Sunday, May 16**, we'll put the plants in the garden! There will be tasks both large and small, so come on out with the family even for a short while. Help make something beautiful and useful!

A Measure of Progress and a Lot of Hesed

All of us need a lot of Hesed (lovingkindness) right now. Luckily our PreK-7 students are ending the year with a five-week module on Hesed. Perhaps you heard Rabbi Spivak talk about it in his sermon at our joint Shabbat service?

This has been a difficult year for all of us and some parents chose to limit their child's participation in school as a way to lessen their family's stress. Others chose to focus their child in other activities that the child needed this year. Some students dove into their religious school studies as a way to deal with the boredom of being home all day every day. We have all had to focus on self-care and none of us, parents included, should feel guilty about the choices we made. We all did the best we could.

Some children thrived with online learning, while others not so much. Every single child in our school grew in amazing ways and the teachers and I are proud of all of them. We are also proud of our parents for making the difficult decisions about what was best for their children when the world around them became full of danger and risk for their family. We are impressed by all that they did to help their children succeed this year as everything changed about the way we did school.

Measuring What Our Students Learn

We've been working hard to develop better ways to measure, report and analyze our students' progress. When I began my tenure as director three years ago, we had very little data about what our students strengths and weaknesses were or how they were performing. Coming from a lifelong career in healthcare with much of it involving performance improvement, I set about gathering data. We now collect data in three areas of Hebrew learning:

- I. Reading Skills
- 2. Prayer Skills
- 3. Vocabulary

Reading Skills. Three years ago we began measuring Hebrew Reading Skills. We identified a benchmark (ability to recognize and sound out Hebrew consonants, vowels and words) and tested our students using a standardised test. Using the data from the test, we developed a plan to bring all of our students up to our benchmark in one year. We have been able to maintain that level of performance ever since.

Prayer Skills. For the last two years we have been working on a method to measure student's prayer skills. We again identified our benchmarks (students can read the text, recite from memory, sing their congregation's melody, understand the overarching meaning of the prayer and understand key vocabulary words from the prayer). We documented our students' progress on the prayers they learned during the fall semester and have a plan to complete the documentation for each prayer the student has studied. We expect to be able to provide this information to our parents at the end of the school year. Next year we will develop a plan to ensure that every student meets our benchmark for each prayer in our curriculum.

Vocabulary. This year as a part of our Hebrew Through Movement curriculum, we began measuring our students' understanding of Hebrew vocabulary. Once again we identified a benchmark (students demonstrate an understanding of 75% of the vocabulary words taught) and documented our students' progress.

We are proud of the objective data we have been able to collect. Each year we set targets to improve our data collection and our students' performance. Each year we improve in both the way we measure and how our students perform. If we did not have benchmarks or if we did not measure, we would not know how this pandemic year affected our students' learning. Because of the data collection process we have been developing, we know our students reached the targets we set for them. I have the data to back up what I said earlier in this article, "every single child in our school grew in amazing ways."

As always, thank you for sharing your wonderful children with us. It is a special honor to teach them and watch them learn and grow. L'dor v'dor.
