Endings and New Beginnings

How did it happen that it's January 1st? We have already passed the shortest day of the year and here at CoM we are

talking about Tu B'Shvat, Purim and believe it or not, Pesach. AND we are talking about our Israel trip! Rosh Hashanah may be the beginning of the Jewish Year but we think January is also good for beginnings.

We talk a lot about the number seven in Judaism and its significance of completion. Seven days of creation, seven days of the year, seven years in the agricultural cycle. But there is another number, eight, which takes us to an even higher realm. It is on the eighth day, in the eighth month, the eighth year, that we both finish something and begin again in a higher place.

Think of the musical scale: do, re, mi, fa, so, la, ti. Seven notes, a complete scale. But I suspect you may have sung it to yourself and noticed there is an additional note after ti – do. "And that brings us back to do-do-do-do." The same note, yet it is an octave higher - we completed and we began all at the same time.

Perhaps the most famous "8" in Judaism is the day of circumcision. At this point, the newborn boy has completed his first week and with the circumcision enters the second more connected to God. Aaron prepared for the priesthood for seven days and on the eighth was called forth to serve. And on the eighth day, after seven days of Sukkot, we celebrate Shemini Atzeret when according to the rabbis the judgment of the High Holidays ends and "a new beginning is made." (Zohar, Tzav 31b)

Sampson Raphael Hirsch suggests that eight is a number indicating that "the condition of the previous period is entirely closed, and with the eighth, a new beginning is made."

So, as we close out the secular year of 2021, let this be a time of closure and a time of new beginnings. Let us continue to keep our homes and hearts warm while we open our doors to all who would come in.


Unlimited Cards for All Occasions

Spiritual Leadership Search Committee

As we close out this year, I am grateful for our CoM community. You have welcomed Rabbi Estrin with open arms, taking risks in trying new ways of doing things under her leadership, finding comfort in traditions that remain, and embracing the chaos and energy that comes with change and renewal.

The Spiritual Leadership Search Committee (SLSC) has been working hard to find the next long-term spiritual leader for CoM. This task is a challenging one this year because of a skewed job market. According to the Rabbinical Assembly (RA), several dozen rabbis are retiring this year and fewer students in the graduating classes are seeking traditional pulpits.

The SLSC has posted the RA Questionnaire (the online application) and has not received any applications at this point. Recently the RA granted all A-sized congregations (which includes CoM) a waiver to post their positions outside of the RA process. The SLSC will move forward with posting our position with the Academy of Jewish Religion (AJR), a trans-denominational institution. We have also requested permission to post in the Reconstructionist placement center. This will help us to expand our candidate pool, while still looking for a rabbi who fulfills our needs.

The SLSC will continue to work on creative alternatives for next year and we remain optimistic about our ability to problem solve, in partnership with the entire CoM community. If you know of rabbinical candidates from any denomination who would respect and honor our traditions as a conservative Jewish congregation, please let someone on the committee know.

Look Who Paid A Visit to CoM!

Stacey Fisher, a Kalamazoo native who now lives in Seattle, stopped by recently with her son so she could show him how the Fisher family and the history of CoM are inextricably connected.

Stacey's son is a volunteer with the Israel Defense Forces. Her parents were Morton (a Kalamazoo native) and Joyce (a Benton Harbor native) Fisher and her sisters are Jennifer Fisher (now living in Evanston, IL), Molly Fisher Goodman (now living in the Boston area) and Beth Fisher (now living in Madison, WI). Stacey and her three sisters became B'nai Mitzvah at Congregation of Moses and were all married here too.

Her great-grandparents, Max and Jennie Fisher, were founding members of the synagogue. Their youngest children were Herman (wife Rose) and Herbert (wife Barbara) who took over the Fisher-Graffiti Steel corporation (essentially a scrap yard) from their father and Mr. Graff.

Herman's son Jack was a lawyer in Kalamazoo who was instrumental in making Kalamazoo the first place that had ramps in sidewalks so that people with disabilities/in wheelchairs could have access and safety while downtown.



Herbert's two children were

Morton (wife Joyce) and Marcia (husband Martin Kalb), names well known at CoM for their enthusiastic participation. The Kalb's two daughters, Susan Kalb Weinberg (now living in Ann Arbor) and Nancy Kalb Yaffe (now living in Madison, WI) both became B'nai Mitzvah at CoM and were also married in our sanctuary.

Morton and Joyce, whose photos adorn our wall of former leaders, were very active in synagogue operations. Joyce, a longtime sisterhood member and president, was regarded as the queen of the kitchen and considered it her second home. In fact, we have Joyce to thank for hiring Shirley Mengel!

Morton, long active in the Men's Club, also served as CoM president in the early 1980s. The Fisher Library honors Stacey's great uncle and aunt, Herman and Rose Fisher, and the Joyce and Morton Fisher Kitchen Oneg/Kiddush Fund honors the hospitable couple.

Many fondly remember the Fisher and Kalb families and would be pleased to know that their lineage has continued to be active in Jewish life and maintain a commitment to Israel.
