Discussion of *Reimagined*, by Barbara Rapaport. The author will join the latter half of the meeting.

Barbara Rapaport is known in the Grand Rapids community for her work as an executive leadership coach who released her first book last year, a memoir called *Reimagined*. The book is summarized on Amazon:

"All her life, Barbara Rapaport had been struggling to reconcile two sides of her personality: the one who felt compelled to remain behind the scenes and the one who gave herself permission to stand in the spotlight. In this candid and emotionally true memoir, Rapaport recounts her harrowing experience battling a rare form of cancer.

"With extraordinary self-awareness, *Reimagined* toggles back and forth between Rapaport's adult cancer journey and the childhood trauma that gave rise to these false beliefs. Her story beautifully illustrates a truth many of us live with: that our childhood demons are never very far away. But with courage and fortitude we can gain the perspective necessary to acquire what's long avoided us: radical self-acceptance."

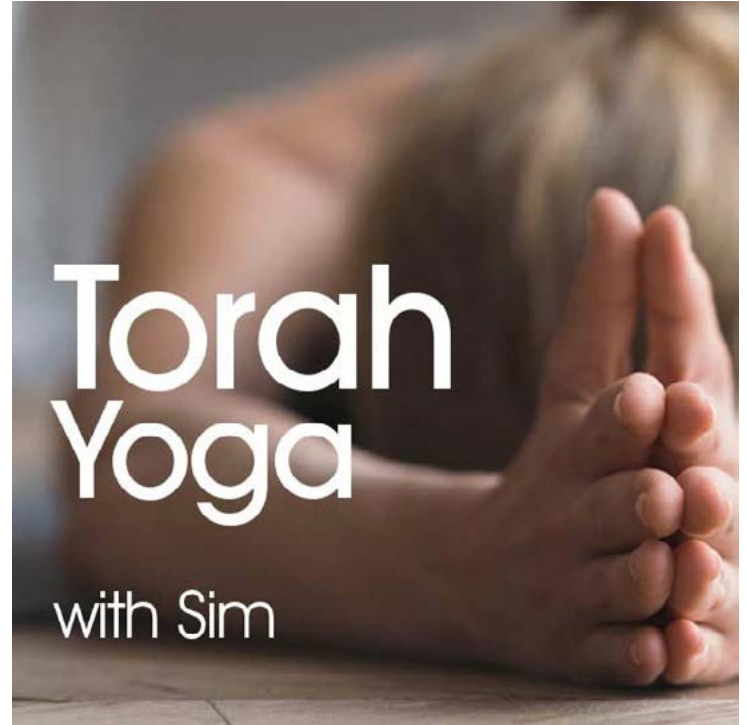
Torah Yoga with Sim Birnbaum

In late September prior to the start of Rosh Hashanah, CoM held an in-person security training with Gary Sikorski of Secure Community Network. The Secure Community Network (SCN) is the official safety and security organization of the Jewish community in North America.

Gary met with staff members and did a brief walk-through of the building where he performed an assessment of security measures, and led an evening program for members, attended by about 25 people.

He left us with simple suggestions for improved procedures, questions to consider and a comprehensive list of suggestions for security improvements.
