I look forward to seeing you at the 9:00 am Morning Shofar Zoom session each day during the Jewish month of Elul, beginning on September 4. A rotating cast of characters will help you set an intention for the day through poetry or song and then you'll hear the sound of the Shofar. A great use of ten minutes or less!

We have two evening sessions of High Holy Day Prep! On **September 17**, we will screen "Hallelujah: Leonard Cohen, A Journey, A Song" – a great documentary and a fabulous film for the month of Elul. Discussion to follow.

Milestones and Events of the Past Year

• Rabbi Shelley Goldman celebrated her one-year anniversary with us on August 1, our office manager, Kristil Semrau celebrated her one-year anniversary two weeks earlier and our building manager, Rich Wojtas, recently celebrated his three-year anniversary. Mazal Tov!

• Our joint Marvin and Rosalie Okun Kalamazoo Community Jewish school had 37 students this past school year. Director Angie Saltzman will return for her second year this fall!

• In April, we formally installed Rabbi Goldman; over 120 people attended, including Rabbi Goldman's mentor, Rabbi Wechterman, and many community leaders. Mayor David Anderson even delivered a proclamation!

• Less than two weeks later, we celebrated a community seder for the second year in a row, with over 100 participants!

• The Free Store for refugees, in the former youth lounge, served in the past six months over 440 refugee shoppers from 17+ countries, many of whom have never been in a synagogue. Thank you to all our community volunteers.

• The Samuel J. and Mary E. Colef Fund has distributed more than \$1.6 million to date, over \$300,000 in 2023 alone, benefitting those in need in our community and Israel, including helping those affected by the October 7 attacks.

• Our membership count rose to 108 families at the end of 2023.

• Last October, not only did we build our new, larger sukkah, we debuted a bonus sukkah to ensure there was room for all!

• Last September, we installed a new Yarhzeit Board, and volunteers have been putting families back together.

• Ongoing joint programming: Adult Ed classes, Mahjong, Tashlich, Sukkot, Simchat Torah celebration, Hanukkah Bazaar, Purim celebration and more!

The continued success of CoM rests on the support of its members. This Yom Tov season, we embark on our first major capital campaign in over a decade as we work toward **two major renovation projects**.

First, we will be replacing all of our external doors, as well as the sanctuary doors—almost all of which are original—to increase our safety and security. Second, we will be replacing many of the aging—and not completely functional—appliances in our kitchen, allowing us to continue preparing meals and onegs for special occasions. We are pleased to announce that we have already raised over \$40,000 in seed money from a few members of our congregation toward these projects. We will need to raise an additional \$100,000 over the next three years to fund these projects. 

New Policies For Donations at the Friends Free Store

The following is excerpted from a new security policy adopted by the Friends Free Store, developed to align with security policies at CoM.

"The Friends Free Store, housed at the Congregation of Moses, invites refugees new to Kalamazoo to shop in the free store (when accompanied by a caseworker) and donors from the greater Kalamazoo community to drop off merchandise, according to the following policies. Store volunteers have set store hours for shopping and donations: 9:00 am to 3:00 pm Monday through Thursday, except on Jewish, state or federal holidays or when the building is closed (such as when all staff are on vacation).

"Donation drop-off should also be arranged by appointment, so that volunteers are present to help with the unloading. Congregation of Moses staff are not obliged to accept donations when store volunteers are not present."

To sum up, donation drop-off should be arranged by appointment during a time period of 9:00 am to 3:00 pm, Monday through Thursday, except on holidays or when the building is closed. Drop-offs made without an appointment may not be accepted.
