SHANAH TOVAH

At a recent CoM movie night, we enjoyed the 2021 documentary *Hallelujah: Leonard Cohen, a Journey, a Song.* It explores Cohen's life, writing process and the cultural phenomenon of the song. One interviewee said, "He made the word Hallelujah acceptable again." Fellow musician and Jew Regina Spektor commented, "You get the feeling of hearing a modern prayer."

One of the reasons that I love the song is encapsulated in Cohen's explanation of it: "You look around and you see a world that cannot be made sense of. So you either raise your fist or you say 'hallelujah!" The depth of the song is apparent the first time one truly hears it and, because it is a prayer for our time, it has long been my tradition at High Holy Day services to sing Psalm 150 to its tune. When we gather as a community in the coming days and weeks, you can look forward to this new CoM tradition.

You will also hear a stirring rendition of the ancient prayer Shema Koleynu which begins: *Hear our voice*, *ADONAI our God*, *be kind*, *and have compassion for us. Willingly and lovingly accept our prayer*. One of my favorite aspects of the High Holy Days is the combination of words old and new as we struggle to make sense of the past year and prepare to be better in the year to come.

Who, Still Broken by Alden Solovy

Who by fire, Screaming with seared flesh? Who by water, Gasping for one more breath?

Rock of life,
Tell me that these are not
Your tools of justice.
Tell me that these are not
Your verdicts or Your punishments.
How do You bear the cries
Of Your children?
The starving,
The battered,
Buried in rubble
Or washed to sea?



This year, we're thrilled to welcome 38 students in grades PreK-7th. Our students come from both CoM and TBI. We have seven high school students participating in the Teacher Assistant program. In addition, six adult teachers and two rabbis are making sure our students get a valuable Jewish education.

The first day of school on September 15th was a resounding success, filled with moments of connection and excitement, as students and teachers alike built new relationships. The kikar at CoM provided a welcoming space for these meaningful interactions to take place outside of the traditional classroom setting. Some of the students had not seen each other since the last day of school. They enjoyed running around, talking, hula hooping and playing catch.

But the excitement didn't stop there! On September 22nd, the students had the privilege of being treated to a special guest, award-winning Cuban-American author Ruth Behar. Ms. Behar captivated our younger students (PreK-3rd) by reading her touching picture book, *Tía Fortuna's New Home*. Then, she inspired our older group (4th-7th) with a reading of her book, *Across So Many Seas*. Ms. Behar provided two activities, the Suitcase of Memories and Your Own Key for the younger group that tied to *Tía Fortuna's New Home*. The students pondered over what items they would pack in one suitcase and enjoyed designing a paper

key to open the door to their special place.

In a delightful display of intergrade collaboration, the 6th and 7th grade students designed an obstacle course as part of their Judaism class, which the 2nd & 3rd grade students joyfully navigated through. They had to make their way under and over items as well as throw a ball through a sometimes moving hula hoop!

The continued success of CoM rests on the support of its members. This Yom Tov season, we embark on our first major capital campaign in over a decade as we work toward **two major renovation projects**.

First, we will be replacing all of our external doors, as well as the sanctuary doors—almost all of which are original—to increase our safety and security. Second, we will be replacing many of the aging—and not completely functional—appliances in our kitchen, allowing us to continue preparing meals and onegs for special occasions. We are pleased to announce that we have already raised over \$40,000 in seed money from a few members of our congregation toward these projects. We will need to raise an additional \$100,000 over the next three years to fund these projects.


