Give!

Over the past month I've had several conversations with different people about our responsibilities to each other in 2025. Congregants have been asking me the questions: How do we best take care of each other? How do we protect ourselves in this ever-evolving new reality?

I humbly submit that Jewish tradition and practice have a lot to teach us about surviving the hard times. It is a mitzvah, a commandment, to give tzedakah to others. We often translate the word mitzvah as "good deed" but the word, translated literally, means "commandment." It is a commandment from God, with roots in the Torah text itself, to give material support to other people. The literal meaning of tzedakah is "justice" not "charity," as it is often translated. One gives charity when one feels generous and decides to share, while one is commanded to give tzedakah no matter what.

When I was first thinking through the implications of giving tzedakah, I asked a lot of questions. Are poor people required to give tzedakah? Maybe they give less than the required 10% of their money? Friends and teachers advised me that while no one should impoverish themselves by giving tzedakah, there is dignity in giving to others even if you yourself do not have a lot of money, even if you yourself are supported by tzedakah.

My friend's Orthodox community in Israel advises that all of one's tzedakah, ten percent of one's income, should go to the synagogue to distribute to those in need. As someone who gives to causes both inside and outside the Jewish community, I asked my friend if his family actually gives ten percent to the synagogue? He responded no: we give eight percent to the synagogue and reserve two percent to give to other causes. These are not wealthy people and yet they give ten percent of their income! They give because it is commanded by God. They give because it is the right thing to do.

There is a Jewish story that helps move us towards this goal. God gives us what we've got and allows us to keep ninety percent of it for ourselves and our family. God gives us the honor and responsibility to pass along the ten percent. The money we have for tzadakah does not belong to us, it is merely in our care.

Now that we have established the responsibility to give tzedakah, the next question is where? Jewish tradition also speaks to this question. We are responsible first to our family, then to our community, then to humanitarian causes. For most of Jewish history, these concentric circles were understood as solely within the Jewish community: Our Jewish family, our local Jewish community, the Jewish poor elsewhere, especially in Israel.

We now include our Jewish and non-Jewish family in the first concentric circle. We now understand that we also have a responsibility to the non-Jewish poor in our community. We now give tzedakah to those in need all over the world, both Jews and non-Jews.

In an article about this very subject, the past chair of American Jewish World Service, Don Abramson writes: "As it is, Americans give at most two-three percent of their income to charity and there is little evidence to suggest that Jews contribute a lot more than average Americans, irrespective of aspirational tithing standards. "Given the reality that most of us are still reaching for the prescribed ten percent, he advises: "In addition to non-tzedakah communal obligations, one should give ten percent of discretionary income or one percent of net worth to tzedakah, whichever is greater."

You may be asking yourself why this is the subject of my January newsletter article, as opposed to the December article? It is precisely because most people think about giving in December that I'm writing about this now. To achieve our tzedakah giving goals we must work at it all year long.

This year I am starting a new custom of looking at my most recent tax return when contemplating how much my family can give and making a plan to distribute my giving across all twelve months of the year. It is much easier to give on an ongoing basis than to wait until December when such an amount might break the bank.

Larry Moses, the philanthropic adviser to the Wexner family, writes: "Tzedakah teaches us what is required to be fully human. Philanthropy teaches us what is possible in recognizing God's image in the world around us and in repairing that world."

May you go from strength to strength in this new year.

BUILDING RENOVATIONS UNDERWAY

As many of you know, we have begun two major renovation projects to update our kosher kitchen and to increase security at all our entryways.

In terms of updates for progress, the kitchen has been painted and is being thoroughly cleaned, with new equipment being installed in January.

The operations security subcommittee has been collaborating with Special-Lite and other vendors to replace all of our exterior doors, as well as the sanctuary doors with modern, high-security versions including bullet-and shatter-resistant glass. All the doors except for those in the lobby sanctuary and the main entrance have been completed; the last two sets of doors should be completed in January.



THE CONSPIRACY begins with a man in front of a wall of computers. As he descends down an internet rabbit hole, a chorus of voices coalesces around one idea: There is a secret group controlling the world, and that group is an international network of Jews. Featuring the voices of Jason Alexander, Mayim Bialik, and Liev Schreiber, THE CONSPIRACY is an animated documentary that shows how a centuries-old myth has moved from the fringe to the mainstream, becoming a pillar of modern antisemitism.

Saturday morning Kiddush is an integral part of the celebration of Shabbat and hosting one is a great way for you to be involved in the CoM community. It is important that all members occasionally host Kiddush so that the responsibility is spread out over the entire congregation.

We only ask that you notify us immediately if this is the case. We will be able to find an alternative date for you, but we will need time to find a replacement host and reassign you.
