Inner Strength Required

On Purim, we read the book of Esther. The story takes place entirely outside of the land of Israel. This story is about lews living under threat.

One of the most famous lines of the book comes to us in Chapter four, verses 13 and 14. Mordecai has just asked Esther to "step up" and save the Jews from Haman by speaking directly to the king. Esther equivocates, reminding her uncle that if someone approaches the king without an invitation they might be sentenced to death.

Mordecai's response is the stuff of legends and quests.

He says: "Do not imagine that you, of all the Jews, will escape with your life by being in the king's palace. On the contrary, if you keep silent in this crisis, relief and deliverance will come to the Jews from another quarter, while you and your father's house will perish. And who knows, **perhaps you have attained a royal position for just such a crisis!**"

This is one of the most impressive charges I have ever read. It is a call to action. A call to use your powers for good, even if your power pales in comparison to the power of your opponent.

Esther is a favored wife in a system that does not expect much of women, but with the right coaching and encouragement she becomes a hero for the ages. She bests Haman and beats back an existential threat. Would that we could all use our power to make such a difference!

In Jewish culture, the sentence "And who knows, perhaps you have attained a royal position for just such a crisis" has come to mean, "This is a job for you. This is your task. This will be your contribution to our unfolding story."

It makes me think of the Marianne Williamson quote, often attributed to Nelson Mandela, "Our deepest fear is not that we are inadequate. Our deepest fear is that we are powerful beyond measure. It is our light, not our darkness, that most frightens us. We ask ourselves, 'Who am I to be brilliant, gorgeous, talented, fabulous?' Actually, who are you not to be? You are a child of God. Your playing small doesn't serve the world."

The Book of Esther does not contain the name of God, not even once. The Rabbis had to look for clues of God's presence in this story. They found just such a clue in our verses. These sentences are about harnessing our inner strength.

Where does that inner strength come from? It comes from a curious mix of education, experience and good mentorship.

Inner strength requires the extra special spice of something intangible. Perhaps this spice comes from The Universe? Perhaps it comes from God?

During the first session of the series, **beginning on Saturday, March 8 at 12:30 pm**, this book will provide the context for thoughtful and meaningful discussions that will lead to effective and practical action. The remaining two sessions will be devoted to a closer examination of the chapters in the book, as well as discussion of the results of the Evolve Symposium, "Practices for Defending Democracy."

In October 2024, 26 rabbis and lay leaders participated in this symposium by describing how they are able (or unable) to pursue the 20 practices that are outlined in Dr. Snyder's book as a response to tyranny and hate.

Participants in this series will gain a better understanding of the strengths and weaknesses of tyrannical movements and learn about strategies and techniques to not only cope with, but neutralize the power that has been granted to modern-day tyrants.

"On Tyranny" is a call to arms and a guide to resistance, with invaluable ideas for how we can preserve our freedoms in the uncertain years to come.

HEBREW FREE LOAN




Money, Goods and Time Needed to Help Our Local Refugee Families

As you are probably aware, the federal government has illegally halted Congressionally-approved funding for refugee services, leaving many families with no funds for housing, food or other needs, and no caseworkers to

help them navigate the systems.

How can you help?

- Donations are still very much needed and welcomed at the Friends Free Store. Please choose items thoughtfully, particularly things useful for winter or for setting up a new apartment. The store continues to need blankets, warm winter outerwear and boots of all sizes. Adult men's and teen boys winter clothes are especially in demand.
- A resettlement fund was set up three years ago for members of People's Church, the Congregation of Moses and Temple B'nai Israel.
