Fight Antisemitism - Let's Work for Peace

I have been profoundly moved by the statements put out by the Conservative, Reform and Reconstructionist Movements in response to the killings in D.C. Below is what I read on Shabbat right after it happened, drawing almost entirely on the statements by the movements. I offer this statement and a poem by Rabbi Mordechai Rackover as a balm for these times.

We are filled with profound sadness, tremendous anger, outrage and vulnerability as we grieve the loss of Yaron Lischinsky and Sarah Lynn Milgrim. Both worked for the Israeli embassy and committed themselves to supporting Zionism, the Jewish State and the Jewish people. That they were murdered outside Washington's DC Capitol Jewish Museum shakes us to the core.

An assassination on American soil outside a Jewish communal event is an act of base antisemitism that is irredeemably destructive. A path to a more just world requires a steadfast commitment to seeing each other's humanity and building bridges, not hate and violence.

May Sarah and Yaron's memories be a blessing and may their loved ones find comfort. May we all work to end antisemitism here and around the world, fight against terrorism everywhere and exert ourselves to bring peace.





Hollywood, An Empire of their Own, Thursday, June 12, 7:00 pm

Produced by Arts and Entertainment and based on a best-selling book by Neal Gabler, "An Empire of their Own: How the Jews Invented Hollywood." The video provides the inside story of how Jewish moguls, who were almost all immigrants from Eastern Europe or their children, created the great Hollywood studios and produced the movies which brought drama, comedy, laughter and tears to hundreds of millions of people and defined American culture for decades. There is plenty of footage in the video from the golden age of Hollywood. The video also raises the question of why the Jewish moguls chose to avoid Jewish issues in their movies. The video will be followed by a group discussion on the Jewish Influence in American popular culture.

Broadway Musicals, A Jewish Legacy, Thursday, July 10, 7:00 pm

Produced by PBS. Tap your feet and hum along as we watch segments of the most endearing Broadway musicals, and learn the story of how Jewish composers, lyricists and producers created the beloved songs and stage performances which are uniquely American and Jewish in form and message. The video will be followed by a group discussion on the topic (and obligations) of the Jews as a gifted people.

Saturday morning Kiddish is an integral part of the celebration of Shabbat and hosting a Kiddish is a great way for you to be involved in the CoM community. It is important that all members occasionally host Kiddish so that the responsibility is spread out over the entire congregation.

Each member of the CoM community is asked to host a Kiddish two-three times per year. Two member families are randomly assigned a date to co-host. Dennis Means or Wilma Kahn will be on hand to answer questions on your Shabbat morning. You will also receive an email about a month in advance with detailed instructions. You do not need to purchase food, though you may if you wish. **The request is purely to set up and clean up our normal fare.**

Please find your date on the schedule below and confirm by email that you will be able to host on that Shabbat morning. We realize that some of the dates might not work for you. We only ask that you notify us immediately if this is the case. We will be able to find an alternative date for you, but we will need time to find a replacement host and a new date for you.
